Constitution

- 1. This Association shall be known as the Tarrant County Baptist Missionary Association.
- 2. This Association shall be composed of churches, by means of messengers that are members of, and elected by, the church sending them.
- 3. The officers of this Association shall consist of moderator, assistant moderator, clerk-treasurer, assistant clerk-treasurer.
- 4. It shall be the duty of this Association on the first day of each annual meeting to elect her officers for the following year.
- 5. New churches may be admitted to this fellowship on presentation of petitionary letters at the annual session of messengers sent from their church for such purpose, providing that on examination they be found to be in fellowship, in doctrine, faith, and practice with the churches of this Association. The moderator shall extend the right hand of fellowship to the messengers.
- 6. Each church shall be allowed five messengers.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the churches of this Association to provide a fund to defray expenses of the Association, including local missions, correspondence, and clerk hire.
- 8. It shall be the duty of each church in this Association to send a letter annually by her messengers, naming the messengers, the number of members received since the last Association, and how received, number dismissed and how. Also, the amount of funds sent in and for what purpose.
- 9. This Association shall have no power to lord over the churches, but shall function as an advisory council.
- 10. In all cases where there is difference between church or individuals of this Association, the same rule shall be observed as taught in Matthew 18 and other Scriptures corresponding therewith.
- 11. In the event of heresy in doctrine or unscriptural practice on the part of any church of this Association, having come to the notice of the Association, and after the Association has exhausted every scriptural effort to convert the church of the erroneous ways, it shall be the duty of the other churches of the Association to withdraw fellowship from the offending church.

- 12. This Association shall correspond with other associations of like faith and order as she may direct.
- 13.All matters coming before the Association shall be determined by will of the majority of the members present, except that of receiving churches, which shall be by unanimous vote. Associations that we correspond with shall be determined by a two-thirds majority.
- 14.No query shall be received by this Association until it shall have been taken up and elected upon by the church in which it originated. Then if the church fails to get satisfaction, it may be received.
- 15. This Association shall be governed by regular decorum.
- 16.As Baptists we do not hesitate to say that as it respects Missionary Institutions, we will not be bound to contribute to any, but will be left to act as the Word of God may lead us to do.
- 17. This Constitution may be changed, amended or altered at any regular meeting of the Association, by a two-thirds majority of messengers present.
- 18. This Association endorses the New Hampshire Confession of Faith as a representative compendium of what Baptist have historically believed through the centuries. We refer particularly to the edition in J. E. Cobb's *Church Manual* (third edition), published by the Baptist Publications Committee of Texarkana, Texas.
- 19. This Association shall meet annually at 9:30 AM on the third Saturday in September at such place as may be designated by the Association in annual session.
- 20.Newly elected officers shall not take over until the end of the annual meeting.

Rules of Decorum

- 1. The Association shall be opened with prayer.
- 2. All officers shall be chosen on the first day of the annual meeting by the messengers present.
- 3. The moderator shall be considered the judge of order, but any member shall have the right to rise to a point of order as they deem necessary.
- 4. Any member not satisfied with the moderator's ruling may appeal to the Association for a change on the same day; not later.
- 5. Only one person may speak at a time, after rising and addressing the moderator and getting recognition, then only shall he speak.
- 6. The speaker shall not be interrupted until he has given his light, unless he gets out of order, then shall he be called to order.
- 7. The speaker shall adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the ones who have spoken before, by remarking of his failings or the ones who have spoken before, by remarking of his failings or imperfections, but shall strictly present his idea of the matter at hand.
- 8. No appellation except that of Brother or Sister shall be used in the Association.
- 9. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk and called as often as the Association may require.
- 10. The moderator may not interrupt any messenger, nor prohibit any member from speaking until he has given his light, except he be breaking the rule of the decorum.
- 11. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other provided the chair is filled, but shall not vote unless the Association is equally divided.
- 12. If any member shall knowingly and willingly break these rules, he or she shall be removed as the Association may think proper, This is to be done on the same day of the offense.

PROGRESS ON MISSION

God is steadily surprising and amazing us as we walk step by step with a burden to see 100 new churches established and many churches strengthened in the BMA of Texas by 2029. We are seeing God all over the details, big and small. Let me share a few with you:

Men are answering the call and boldly stepping out to reach the area God has drawn them to. Your church is now supporting 29 church planting locations and you are taking care of 35 families who are engaged in the work! This is more new churches than the BMA has ever seen.



God has provided the resources to take care of these men through you! You and your sister churches have increased your giving to the general fund and to individual mission resource funds. Four BMA Texas churches are currently taking the lead in planting churches themselves. We are gladly in the second seat assisting them. The Texas WMA has outfitted an outreach trailer that is assisting in gospel sharing. Sadly, three sister churches have recently closed their doors but made the choice to give significant resources of property and money so that new churches could begin as their continued legacy. Thank you past members of Dallas Park, Dallas; First, Gary and Oak Grove, Canton. Their gifts will result in disciples multi-

plied.

Men, women, and children are being saved and discipled! Your missions movement is really not focused on starting churches. We are focused on sharing Jesus, making disciples, equipping leaders, and multiplying. We are focused on the Great Commission and God is faithfully building churches. Hundreds are being saved all over the state in cities and small towns.

Existing churches are being strengthened through Acti-



vate, workshops we are providing to pastors and church members, and through their loving engagement with mission projects. We continue to financially support Activate in assisting Texas churches. We bring the workshops we use to equip missionaries into churches upon request. Excitedly, BMA churches that are walking



closely beside a mission point, helping with encouragement projects and resources are receiving so much back. They are being inspired to focus on the great commission with urgency and are being equipped with new tools simply by their interaction. We encourage you to adopt a work in your mission family.

We see God in every little detail. He provides places to worship. He provides open doors to outreach. He provides the people that connect with people and resources. He provides open doors with hospitality. He provides equipping. He provides the fellowship and accountabilitynecessary for encouragement, correction and rebuke. He continues to provide more people necessary for coaching, mentoring, training and shepherding care. He is steadily strengthening your men on the field as they face trial after trial with perseverance and celebrate victories as a result.

On behalf of my secretary, Cassie Fulton, and our 13 trustees, it's a joy to provide this annual report. We're thankful for the opportunity to serve the churches of the BMA of Texas, and offer financial assistance to growing churches.

Recently we made a loan to a church that has been in decline, but now they are growing. People are trusting Jesus as personal Savior, and families are joining the fellowship. This is a personal blessing to me and our trustees.

Our purpose becomes a reality when we make a loan. We assist churches with financial needs to build buildings, remodel or add to existing buildings, and purchase property.

At the end of August, we have 253 investors, and our total assets are \$14.5 million. We now provide loans for 21 projects, and have sufficient money available to help other growing churches. If your church plans to build, remodel or purchase property, it would be a joy to talk with you about a loan.

I am very thankful to our trustees who serve faithfully and enthusiastically to make wise decisions concerning our finances and making loans. Our trustees include pastors, and men and women of various business backgrounds. They are a great help to me, and I appreciate their leadership. There are three ways to financially support the Loan Association:

- A contribution from and individual or church
- An interest free deposit
- Interest deposits that compound quarterly. Currently we are paying 2 percent on share accounts and 2.5 percent on Investment Certificates. These rates may change during the year depending on the financial climate. Your financial support and prayers are essential for the BMLA to have a part in assisting the BMA of Texas to plant churches and provide funds for growing churches.

Jacksonville College is a mission field. I say this because our sports programs bring numerous students to us who have no church background. I say this because students come to us from all over the world. Last year, thirty-one students from eighteen different countries attended Jacksonville College.

Lifeway statistics tell us that 80 percent of students who grew up attending church leave the church when they go off to college, and they never return. Jacksonville College works to change this statistic. Through our presentation of the gospel, seventy-six students invited Christ into their life this past year. We are the only two-year, faithbased college left in Texas. We integrate faith and learning in every academic discipline. We require Chapel attendance every week, and we allow the local church to come onto our campus and hold Bible studies throughout the week. Jacksonville College exists to provide a quality education from a biblical worldview that challenges minds, transforms lives and equips students for servant leadership and lifelong learning

Jacksonville College recognizes the value of the relationship with our Baptist Missionary Association of Texas churches. When churches give those funds go to support Jacksonville College and its students. For example. Michael Mumba is from Zambia. He came to Jacksonville College to play soccer. We are able to share the gospel and disciple Michael. He will return to Zambia one day with a quality education from Jacksonville College and a transformed life. Seth Hellwig, son of a BMA pastor and BMA Seminary professor, is a student at Jacksonville College. Funds from BMA churches and Associations help provide scholarships so students like Seth and others can afford a college education. Jacksonville College is affordable, it is doctrinally sound, and every subject is taught from a Biblical worldview. Our enrollment is growing in every area. Due to the generous contributions from churches, associations and individuals we are able to continue make improvements to our facilities.

We thank you for your past partnership and ask for your continual prayers and financial contributions so we can provide a quality education from a biblical worldview that challenges minds and transforms lives.

We are so grateful to the Baptist Missionary Association of Texas and every Church that cooperates together to continue making Texas Baptist Home for Children a viable and vibrant organization to help care for kids from hard places. Thank you for your monthly commitment to our ministry and your fundraising events that help keep us operational for children who need us the most. We are blessed by all of you.

TBHC is celebrating 109 years of ministry this year. And as one of the many inheritors of this ministry, I am standing on the shoulders of those who have gone before. It is this faith legacy we all share one generation to the next. TBHC is no exception and my hope is that we can help prepare this organization to be inherited by those who will one day come after.

Our history starts with us being an orphanage, and over time, we are today an adoption and foster care agency. Our organization exists to bring glory to God by caring for children. We want to help kids thrive after trauma by providing quality care that helps give them a future of hope.

As an adoptive dad I can tell you that my children have looked at me and said "I don't want to be treated differently...I don't like being treated like a victim". Why is this? they are adopted. Each of my children experienced trauma, but they are not victims anymore.

This is the Gospel. All of us having once been a victim of the world but no longer are we victims. We are victorious because we are adopted by God!

Our five-year plan is in the process of implementation and we are excited about each and every step. Before we can ever take those steps, Gods' Word gives us the formula to see how we should dream of the future. In Philippians 1:20 Paul continues the conversation of grace with the reader.

"according to my earnest expectation and hope that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death."

So, into our near future we are approaching our plan with great ex-

pectations that God will do something! We plan to have no regrets on our efforts when we look back at what we accomplished. We are going boldly to achieve what we feel God has already set in motion. And most importantly, in all that we do we will magnify Christ.

This is His ministry and we are His stewards. I am personally honored to serve TBHC children, families and staff to fulfill God's great expectations for our ministry. Because no matter how bold or big we expect our ministry to be or how out of reach the resources may seem, our plans are small in contrast to Gods' ability and expectations of obedience.

TBHC operates in the DFW Area of Texas. With offices in Ellis County, Tarrant County and Dallas County. Expansion is planned for these three offices. How can we care for more children? Recruit more foster and adoptive families? How can we gather more churches to rally behind what we are doing? We are unique in that we recruit our families from churches exclusively.

Another expansion plan is looking toward Denton/Collin County. It is placing over half of its kids entering foster care outside of their county. Because of this we are starting the process of soliciting churches to come along side us to minister to the community and help keep kids in their local area.

We plan to hire an estimated 15 new staff before the end of our five-year plan. Each accomplishing a unique purpose within the needs of our agency. Each year will be costly, totaling an expanded financial growth of \$4,000,000.00. But the most significant part of our plan is that our agency would care for over 2,000 children by the end of our five-year plan.

It is my hope that Texas Baptist Home for Children would have influence and opportunity to make a difference wherever God would take us. We need to let every child know that they are important and valued by God because after trauma no one has to stay a victim they can be adopted!

ANOTHER GOOD YEAR FOR BAPTIST PROGRESS

Due to adjustments made in our budget a couple of years ago, Baptist Progress, once more, had a good financial year. We are grateful to all the churches that continue to partner with us in promoting interest in evangelism, benevolence, and Christian education among the churches of the Baptist Missionary Association of Texas.

CIRCULATION

Circulation for Baptist Progress stands at approximately 4,000 subscriptions. Of the almost 400 churches in the BMA of Texas, only 162 are members of the Baptist Progress Church Plan. We can do better, and we encourage every church to join the Church Plan.

For only \$1.75 per month (\$21 per year), per mail subscription, or \$1.25 per month (\$15 per year) per email subscription, churches can provide each of its member households with 12 issues of Baptist Progress for one year. The Church Plan cost is offered at a discounted rate as the standard rate for mail subscriptions is \$24 per year and for email subscriptions, \$18 per year.

Baptist Progress is a ministry that provides members of BMA of Texas churches and other subscribers with news of what God is doing through BMA Texas Missions, Jacksonville College, the Texas Baptist Home for Children, the Baptist Missionary Loan Association and churches across the state.
